**Spring Cleaning on the Potomac**  
Potomac Basin Reporter, April 1994

A growing stewardship ethic was visible throughout the Potomac watershed on April 23, when citizens and private organizations, often backed by government agencies, spent half the day clearing trash from their neighborhood streams. About 1,000 people used the sunlit day to donate their time and muscles to improving local environments.

The longest-running of the river cleanups during the day was organized by the Seafarers Boat Club on the Anacostia River in Washington, D.C. It was the club's ninth consecutive

annual effort. Organizer Howard Gasaway and the club's efforts were aided by the city government, other boat clubs, the Potomac River Pilots Association, the D.C. Lottery Board, a construction company, and others. Volunteers included citizens, club members, and volunteers from some of the city's halfway houses. "It's a lot of work," Gasaway said, but worth it. "The folks enjoy it. We couldn't stop doing this, especially now, with all the good happening toward cleaning up the river, and we've accomplished that goal." The volunteers were joined by Mayor Sharon Pratt Kelly for a cookout afterward on the warm, sunny afternoon. "I think this is the first year that it hasn't rained," the smiling Gasaway said.



### General Assembly Update

Virginia Dept. of Game and Inland Fisheries

Following is a brief update on the Vision 2003 and the 1994 General Assembly actions regarding funding at the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries. Although we had a few minor successes, the Board recognizes that this is merely the *beginning* of a continual process which will ultimately broaden our finding base in the long-term.

#### Boating Services

*Vision:* "By 2003, the number of registered boats in the state is projected to increase, from 206,000 in 1993, to 260,000. One hundred new access sites will need to be opened."

*Steps Toward the Vision:* House Bill 92, which was passed by the 1994 General Assembly and signed by the governor into law, transfers the proceeds of the watercraft sales and use tax to the motorboat and water safety fund (the "boat fund"). The change in the destination of these funds, which formerly went to the state general fund, will be phased in. For Fiscal Year 1996, 50% of collections, or an estimated \$1,250,000, will go to DGIF. By Fiscal Year 2000, 100% of these funds, or an estimated \$2,500,000, will go to DGIF. The revenue will be spent on boating services. A change in the definition of watercraft, which slightly increases the revenue to the boat fund, was also passed by the 1994 General Assembly.

#### Boating Safety

*Vision:* By 2003 "the public waters will be more crowded and potentially more hazardous. ...With the expected growth in boating, public concerns and demands for a safe boating environment will increase."

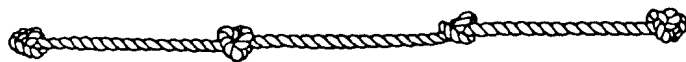
*Steps Toward the Vision:* House bill 1282, which was passed by the 1994 General Assembly and signed by the Governor into law, lowers from 0.10 percent to 0.08 percent the blood alcohol content for which a person can be found guilty of operating a motorboat under the influence of alcohol. And Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) donated video cameras to the DGIF Law Enforcement Division to be used for videotaping suspects in boat operation "under the influence" cases, to aid in prosecuting such cases.

#### Threatened and Endangered Mussels and Agency Hatcheries

*Vision:* DGIF fish hatcheries have historically been used solely to propagate sportfish. But by 2003, "two hatcheries

will contain facilities for propagating threatened and endangered aquatic species."

*Steps Toward the Vision:* In the fall of 1993, for the first time ever, threatened and endangered mussel specials were allotted space in a pond at one DGIF fish hatchery, where they are now being propagated in order to preserve the species and reintroduce them in suitable natural habitat.



### Diving for U-Boats

So all those years of cruising the Potomac River and you thought only crabs and oysters lurked beneath you? Think again. You're lucky you never hooked a German U-boat.

The Maryland Historical Trust has signed an agreement with the Navy to establish the state's first underwater dive preserve off Piney Point, Md., at the site of the World War II sub U-1105, nicknamed the Black Panther.

The sub is the only known surviving example of as many as 10 rubber-clad submarines built near the end of the war as part of Adolph Hitler's "super-weapons" program. One of the earliest examples of stealth technology, the rubber coating helped neutralize Allied sonar detection.

The U.S. government got the submarine as a war prize, and after conducting several tests on it, sank the sub in about 90 feet of water off Piney Point. The dive preserve is set to open this fall, and will be monitored by the Coast Guard and Maryland's Natural Resources Police.

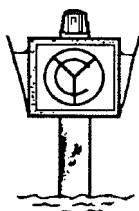
