

BAY CRUISE TO NORFOLK

The three Motor Yachts, the *GAIL LYNN II*, *PLANE TO SEA and SEA VENTURE* departed Port Kinsale on 16 July 2006, destination Yorktown, VA. The Potomac River and the Chesapeake Bay were not forgiving but all three cruised into port at the Yorktown City Marina with no mishaps. We were entertained by the sailing ship "The Alliance" which has been moored at the Yorktown marina since late 2005. There are tours scheduled 3

times daily including an evening sunset cruise. The picturesque and quaint Yorktown waterfront has been rebuilt since its destruction from Hurricane Isabelle. The Old Town area has a clean and

attractive beachfront, good dining, and specialty shops.

At no cost a shuttle picked up our crew on the waterfront and took us through the Colonial National Historical Park -- scene in 1781 of the siege of British forces under General Charles Cornwallis by General George Washington and Count de Rochambeau and the surrender of Cornwallis besieged by Union forces Under General George McClellan during the Civil War and evacuated in 1862). Oh! Also as the shuttle approached Pubs back at the waterfront all jumped off being that is was 1200 hours and we needed to quench our thirst and have a bite of local flavor.

We departed Yorktown Tuesday morning and arrived at Portsmouth and the Tidewater Marina that afternoon. There are museums.



great shops including Antiques, Art, and Specialty and the best, "The Kitchen Koop". Visiting the NAUTICUS Naval museum in Norfolk – reaching it by paddle boat \$.50 one way, and touring the Battleship BB64, USS WISCONSIN, known as Big Wisky was a highlight of our cruise. The Wisconsin and the lowa are the only US Battleships, and they are currently on Mobilization Reserve Status. Except for a couple shoppers, the crew boarded the Victory Rover for a 2 hour Naval Base Cruise viewing Aircraft Carriers, Nuclear Submarines, Guided Missile Cruisers and much more.

The last port of call was to be White Point on the Potomac but weather deteriorated on the Chesapeake changing our port to Deltaville on the Rappahannock and

the Dozier Regatta Point Yacht Center. What a great Marina -- swimming, an all new marina clubhouse and lounge with satellite TV and restaurants nearby that provided transportation. A marina courtesy car was available to take a one hour tour of Deltaville. It was a relaxing two days. The seven hour run to the Occoquan and homeport was smooth and a climax to a wonderful week.


