Cruising Preparation

Here we are well into the cruising season. The dates are all set, the destinations have been worked out and we know who has paid and will definitely be going on the *cruise*. Now, is the boat ready to launch?

JOE HAS A BOAT SAFETY CHECKLIST

Take all the equipment you will need on the other end:

 Know what power cords you will need and put them on board.

- Water hose for cleaning the boat and connecting to shore water.

- Fenders for those tight slips and high winds

- Plenty of towels to keep visual areas clear when running.

- Basic tools to be prepared for small fixes.

- Batteries for flash lights, walkie-talkies etc.

Change the oil if needed and check the batteries for water and corrosion.

Are all of the switches working on the console – radio, horn, lights (nav, spotlight, transom etc.) bilge blowers, generator, trim tabs, radar etc.?

Are the air conditioners in working order (it gets hot in July-August!)?

Waste tank clean and fresh water tank full.

Well, Joe has gone through his checklist and all is in working order.

Gail is responsible for the living area of the boat.

STATEROOM:

Do we have the proper clothes for the trip. (The last trip to Cobb Island Bill and Peg Johnson had a *Jimmy Buffett* party. How about a Jimmy Tee Shirt, oh, and a parrot to adorn your hat!!!)

Extra boat shoes are always a good idea so you have a dry pair in case of rain or *HEAVEN FORBID you* fall in the water!

HEAD:

Toiletries for both and plenty of towels. Our laundry bag is never empty when we are on a cruise and if you run out of underwear there is always a recyclable in there somewhere (get a bag with holes, they work best).

Take along some treasures for the treasure hunt if you are going to the float-in for extra points for OYC:

- Light bulbs for all size lamps 110 and 12 Volt.

 A fan to use in the bathroom, it helps keep down humidity and gives great circulation.

SALON:

Bring games, stock the bar and check the library for proper chart books that includes marina information.

Do we have DVD's and or the cable for TV. Always have extra throw pillows for seating.

GALLEY:

Stock the refrigerator and other food reservoirs. Clean sponges and dishtowels are a must. Don't forget laundry soap for those long cruises and the recyclables (dirty clothes) are to the limit!

Check the recipes for the ingredients you will need to prepare for Happy Hour apps and the just-in-casemeals.

LAUNCHING:

Secure all items and make sure the frig is snapped shut and cabinets are closed.

It is good to have lunch ready ahead of time due to

that unexpected squall's that

hit whenever you least expect it.

Have your lines ready to secure the boat at the first marina or raftup

Make sure the throwable has a 30 ft line attached to it in case of emergency it can be tied securely to the boat and reach the mate in the water.

A bucket is good for bailing and or passing items from your boat to another.
