Commodore's Comments

BOAT SHOW BUSY

Well, the boat shows have come and, for the moment, passed us by. Yes, there are more on the horizon but there's nothing like the Annapolis (Power) Boat Show to get those seafarer emotions really flowing at a time when most Captains are thinking of winterization. On top of Annapolis however, I was doubly lucky to attend the boat show in Tampa, Florida.

At Tampa, I was afforded the opportunity to view what another \$14,000 can get my Captain in increased boating maneuverability – the venerable IPS Joy Stick. Somehow the terms "Joy Stick" and "Boating" just don't seem right when used in the same sentence. Yet here I am using it. In this instance the joy stick is not the one you use for your favorite computer game, although computers are involved. For those not quite up to speed, the Volvo Penta IPS marine drives are now available with a joy stick control that, at lower speeds, allow the boat to be turned completely around in just the length of the boat, as well as to be driven sideways. But the term BOAT (break out another thousand) won't quite make this upgrade possible. Now we're starting to talk REALLY BIG, like taking out a second mortgage on the house. I could always try selling the kids (I always wanted to say that) but they are now grown and out of the house. Perhaps if I could convince the Captain to sell those tools he has in the shed, you know - the ones he never uses, we could make a significant dent in the cost. Of course there is always the

motorcycle, but I think he would probably try to sell me before he would sell his bike. My offer to him may be to use my airline credit card. Then we could use all those mileage points towards that vacation at a far off exotic locale that I have been thinking more and more about lately. At any rate, stay tuned for a possible update.

Going to boat shows can also benefit you in other ways. You may recall the article in last month's Daymarker about when a new boat becomes a used boat. Well ... one of the last manufacturers we visited at Annapolis, in fact it was more of an afterthought, was Regal. After all, that is the boat we now own so we had to see if there was anything new that could possibly help us in our journey to improve our current maintenance situation. Now we have been working with another rep for a short time up to this point, but from our conversation on this day I believe I can actually say there may be a little bit of light visible at the end of the tunnel. This too we will see what is to come.

Going back to my comment about looking at bigger things, Regal is currently designing a 52 foot cruiser and, as luck would have it, another Regal rep was there with a design presentation. Since it was bigger, my Captain was not going to pass up the opportunity to see what he would next be trying to convince me he could not do without. Maybe that retirement date is not as close as I had thought.

It seems that I have created a lot of unanswered questions. Perhaps it is time for a recipe. I am pleased to share the award winning Chocolate Eclair Cake recipe from the October General Membership Meeting. Next time you see Ruth be sure to thank her for a great dessert.

Chocolate Eclair Cake

- 2 3oz pkgs instant vanilla pudding mix
- 3 cups milk
- 1 8oz cool whip
- 1 16 oz pkg graham crackers

Topping:

1/4 cup milk
1/3 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
2 tbsp. Butter
1 cup white sugar
1 tsp. vanilla extract

In a large bowl, combine pudding mix and 3 cups milk; mix until mixture is thickened. Fold in cool whip.

In a 9x13 inch dish, place a layer of graham crackers. Spread 1/2 of pudding mixture over crackers; top with second layer of crackers, final 1/2 of pudding mixture, another layer of graham crackers. (You'll start and end with crackers.)

To make topping: In a medium saucepan over medium heat, combine 1/4 c. milk, cocoa and sugar. Allow to come to a boil, stirring frequently let boil for 1 minute. Remove from heat, add butter and vanilla. Mix well and cool.

Pour sauce over graham cracker layers and refrigerate. (It's best if you refrigerate for at least 4-5 hours, allows graham crackers to soften.)
