I read an interesting article in "Boating Magazine." It listed the top ten "most common offenses that power boaters are likely to get busted for". Here they are:

- 10) No backfire flame control device in compartment spaces.
- 9) Negligent operation.
- 8) Placard violation.
- 7) Inoperable or missing navigation lights.
- 6) Inoperable or missing sound-producing device.
- 5) Fire extinguisher violations.
- 4) Missing or out-of-date visual distress signals.
- 3) Drunken boating.
- 2) State or federal documents missing or improper markings.
- 1) Missing personal flotation devices.

I noticed that many of these offenses are items checked during free Coast Guard Auxiliary vessel safety checks. So, why not be safe this coming season and place a safety check at the top of your spring to-do list. Contact the author for more info and assistance.

Despite the best laid plans, a few more lights and accessories are always necessary, so first-mate Barbara made a hasty trip to local stores to obtain whatever it might take to surpass the competition. And the competition is keen; with 68 boats in the fray, every captain is determined to out-do the next and take home a prize in at least one of the many categories in play.

As the day wears on, and participants finalize their decorating, a sense of camaraderie replaces competitive spirit, and everyone is happy to just be a part of the merriment. Crews head for the festivities and food provided on the main dock. Patrons walk the docks, admiring the handiwork of the

It looks like a fine parade to the hundreds of onlookers gathered on the docks, but the judges in

the reviewing stand have a list of the proper order, and the boats coming past them don't match the list. Fortunately, each boat hails the Judging Stand as it passes, announcing its name, and the judges can alter the order of the roster to be ready for the second pass.

On the second pass, with its name and position clearly identified. Takin' To The Sea was judged to be a lovely entry in the dazzling Parade, but not a prize winner. As guests along for the ride, Harry and I judged her captain, Larry, to be the Grand Prize winner, hands down, for his seamanship and handling skills in guiding his boat through the perils of the parade without mishap: never once hitting one of several boats without lights. Christmas or navigation, that loomed suddenly in the darkness, and managing to keep pace behind boats that stopped or stalled without warning, and avoiding the yacht that anchored, without benefit of lighting, in the path of the parade to get a better view, and, most impressive of all, maneuvering *Takin'* To *The Sea* back into her berth at the dock without a scratch, despite the tight turns required by the close proximity of a tourist boat tied up in front of his slip.
