If your answer is "NO," then skip to the next article in this newsletter. Just in case there was a little spark of interest you might want to know PRYCA/CBYCA stands for Potomac River Yacht Clubs Association and the Chesapeake Bay Yacht Clubs Association, respectively.

The CBYCA is a nonprofit volunteer association of some 129 yacht clubs located from Washington, D.C., Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Virginia. This association, which OYC is a member club, serves the interests of member clubs, advocates safe boating, and represents recreational boating community interests in legislative matters. The Director of State Legislation for Virginia is Jacque Knight of Mount Vernon Yacht Club.

Although smaller with 22 member clubs, the PRYCA's purpose is also to support recreational boating activities, and specifically to "encourage and promote yachting, boating safety and the advancement of yacht clubs within the Potomac River Basin. Combined, these organizations have served us well.

Several OYC members have served in leadership positions with these organizations, including Pat Croft currently serving as a Member at Large (MAL) on the PRYCA Board. I also served and my first mate often attended meetings and events with me...a great experience.

Hope you have benefited from the "little spark of interest" mentioned above. But the real reason for this article is to encourage ALL to get involved and realize the fun, education, and life experience our pastime has to offer. We have made so many good and interesting friends cruising the Potomac.

We are still having difficulty getting enough slips to accommodate the fifteen members who expressed interest. National Harbor Marina continues to guarantee only six slips on the floating docks, and these have been assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. We hope for more as the marina's slipholders pull their boats for the winter.

The mooring ball option, though available, is not a particularly good one, since there is no shuttle service or dedicated dinghy landing area at this time. However, some boats with a high bridge (for egress, due to tide fluctuation) can be accommodated on the fixed pier outside the marina. There is power, and the marina has indicated they will discount the slip price. We are asking for volunteers with appropriately sized boats to take this option so that more of our members with cruisers can attend. Let us know if you are willing to consider this choice.


