Golden Snorkel Award. The award is for "unceremoniously falling into the water", i.e. for OYC members who fall off docks, boats, etc. without incurring serious injury to body. Harry Croft presented it to Commodore Tom Lensis for falling off the *Bay Dreamer* at Colonial Beach Marina.

Bent Prop Award. The Bent prop award is really more like a kind of punishment because the winner gets a trophy to remind the cause of the award. It is given to the member who has successfully gone off course and managed to remove a blade or blades from their props. Most people like to keep this information to themselves because it could be a little embarrassing, especially if you receive the Bent Prop Award. In presenting the award, Commodore Lensis let it out that last year someone was able to keep their mishaps a secret from the nominating committee and was not considered for the award. Little did they know they were sitting at Commodore Lensis' table during last year's COW/Holiday Party. They are not able to receive the award this year because it didn't happen during the 2011 boating season. Not that I would mention their name. This year there was a qualified recipient for the award. Unfortunately the recipient of the award couldn't be with us tonight. This year the coveted Bent Prop Award goes to Jim Hawley on board Lori Ann.

Commodore's Cup. In the past the Commodore's Cup was initially given to the member whose boat "typified the Yacht of the Year, consisting of underway operation, maneuvering and docking, anchoring, and year-round appearance and upkeep." And in later years it has been given as recognition of the member, other than a board officer, who demonstrated the most support for the club and help to fellow boaters. This year the award went to Harry and Pat Croft.

- Preparing the invitations for the COW parties for several years, in addition to helping on the party committee
- To top it off, Harry obtained his Captains License and is knowledgeable in seamanship and navigation.
