WELCOME ABOARD... WHERE'S SPRING???

Remember two years ago? We were overloaded with Winter!

Last year it missed us completely. This year with two months of winter behind us, I think I saw the ground hog sun bathing on a log floating down the Occoguan River.



Does that mean Spring is near, or does it mean hang on for dear life winter is yet to come? Well, either case, your board is hard at work planning for another great year of cruises, land events and socials. Please be sure and let your board know if you have a particular destination you would like sail toward and if you would like to be a Cruise Coordinator. Check the batteries, check the electrical connections to the dock... are they overheated? Open the bilge covers and inspect for any leaks. Even if you boat is on land, now is a good time to inspect the thruhulls, especially plastic ones.



How about the cutlass bearings? Grab the shaft and try to move it around. Does it feel loose? Is the prop dinged? These dark months provide a good time to go over last year's records and make sure your boat is prepared for the upcoming boating season. Too many captains wait too long and miss the many early opportunities to cruise.

This is also a good time of the year to take a Coast Guard Boating Skills and Seamanship Course. If you and your first mate would like to attend such a class, please let me know, and we can arrange it. Maintaining your skills on the water and knowing the rules of the road are critical to a safe and fun time. For those of us that share a real interest in advancing our boating skills, I would like to

suggest getting your USCG Captains License (6-Pak License). What a better way to spend 56 winter hours studying something we all enjoy. Locally, MERG holds classes year round in Woodbridge, Va. http://www.mergllc.com/home.html.

This year, the club has many new members. I would like to encourage our long-time members to make an extra effort to introduce yourself to those you don't know. DEEP-OCEAN CURRENT CIRCULATION

As I mentioned in my last article, this month's commentary is on how deep-ocean waters travel throughout the oceans. To assist our wonderful editor, I will shorten this article!

Deep-ocean circulation is a significantly different process than the movement of water in the surface currents that I discussed last month. Surface currents are profoundly influenced by wind; however, deep ocean circulation is driven by gravity and the water density differences. Two major factors of salinity and water temperature are the most significant factors in the creation of different water densities. Colder water temperatures make water denser, as does increased salinity. Given these two factors, deep-ocean circulation is referred to as "thermohaline circulation". (thermo for 'heat' and haline for 'salt'). The process of deep-ocean circulation begins at the surface of the ocean. As water leaves the surface of the ocean for greater depths, it will not return to the surface again for time periods between 500-2000 years.

The Atlantic Ocean's deep water circulation has been extensively studied and serves as a model to explain the

movement of water at depth. Dense water masses are created in the Arctic and Antarctic regions of the Atlantic Ocean to initiate the deep water circulation process. I will discuss the formation of the densest water first those waters from the Antarctic Ocean.

Antarctic waters are cooled during the winter months and can form ice. When the water freezes into ice, the salt that was carried in that water remains dissolved in the underlying water, making that water even more salty. The resulting water is the densest water on the planet. This incredibly cold and very salty water then slowly sinks to the ocean floor where it sludges along as the Antarctic Bottom Water. It slowly moves northward along the ocean floor, crossing the equator and reaching as far north as 20 degrees North Latitude. In the north Atlantic, the deep-ocean circulation is known as the North Atlantic Deep Water. It occurs when warm waters of the Gulf Stream reach the Arctic region near Greenland. The Gulf Stream waters have high salinity as a consequence of high water evaporation at the surface in the lower, warmer latitudes. As these warm, highly saline waters hit the colder temperatures near Greenland, they sink to the bottom of the North Atlantic Basin. From this point, the cold, dense water oozes south, overriding the denser, heavier Antarctic Bottom Water. Scientists can trace North Atlantic Deep Water to near the Antarctic region until it is obscured by water mixing.

The Atlantic Ocean's deep circulation provides an excellent example of how deep waters move but other important deep water masses have been discovered, to include circulations formed by the chilled Brazil Current and those formed with sources in the Mediterranean and Red Seas. Interestingly, the water mass in the Mediterranean and Red Seas become denser as a result of high surface evaporation and, to a lesser degree, are chilled by the winter temperatures. In these seas, the denser waters move westward along the bottom towards the Strait of Gibraltar.

Next month—the fascinating scientific model that might provide an explanation of the parting of the Red Sea. Till then,

Hi everyone. Since it is too cold outside to play with our water toys, I know you're looking for something to do with your new mobile devices received over the holidays.

I have recently updated the website for the new season, and among the changes was the modification of the *Daymarker* page. I modified the page to provide a link only to the current newsletter, the archives page and *Maydarker* editions since 2002. The establishment of a static link to the current newsletter allows for an easier way to get to the newsletter from the home screen of your tablet or smart phone (e.g. iPad and iPhone). To create the link (bookmark) on Apple devices, follow these instructions:


- 1. Open the OYC site on the tablet or phone
- 2. Navigate to the *Daymaker* page
- 3. Click the current newsletter
- 4. Once the page is open, Click the box with an arrow coming out (top of screen on iPad, bottom on iPhone)
- 5. Select "Add to Home Page".
- 6. Close Safari and locate link on your Home Page

For Android devices do the following:

- 1. Bookmark the page you want to add to a Home Screen
- 2. Open the browser "bookmarks" screen
- 3. Long-press the bookmark you want
- 4. Select "Add to Home Screen"
