

Greetings and Happy New Year to all! It got cold last November, and I was immediately hoping for January so we could start boatplanning for 2015. Focusing on the fun we are going to have will help get me through the snow and ice moments.

Our first event of the year is on 24 JAN, when we will have the Pre-Planfest. It will be held at Johnny and Michelle DeDitius' house, and we would like to invite you to participate if you would like to lead an OYC event (cruise, function) in 2015. Your participation is also welcome if you would like to observe how OYC plans the upcoming year and prepares the schedule for the February "Planfest" meeting (where we present the proposed calendar to all members and more input/ideas are solicited). These two meetings feed the big "General Membership" meeting in March, which also features a photo contest. In addition to Planfest, there will be signup sheets provided at the March meeting for all attendees to sign up for cruises and get on the distribution lists for information on those events.

We would also like to invite you to our monthly Executive Board meetings. January's meeting will occur in conjunction with / at the Pre-Planfest on 24 JAN. Although you must be on the Executive Board to vote on motions presented at those forums, you are able to participate in the discussion at the discretion of the board chair (Commodore), who may limit discussion if timing becomes an issue or if

points are repeated. The February's executive board meeting will occur on 11 FEB at 7 PM at my house. Email me at commodore@occoquanyachtclub.org to get directions to either (or to ask questions concerning anything in this article). This is your club, and you have a say on how things are done.

Some of the items we will discuss at the Pre-Planfest are the budget for 2015, the schedule of land events, and the schedule of sea events. Any insight you can bring to local events (dates and times) could be very helpful as we plan our club events. For instance, the WORLD Police and Fire Games will be held on JUN 26 - JUL 5 2015 with 12000 competitors from around 70 countries. Sounds like a good time to get on a boat and avoid the highways, right? Also, Washington DC hosts National Police Week annually; this year it runs from 11-17 MAY... another good time to avoid scheduling events where we might want to invite local dignitaries. They'll be tied up (hmmm, poor choice of words... on second thought).

Anyway, to summarize, we are now in the "good idea" stage of the 2015 boating season; some of the ideas presented so far include buying and providing to members the BoatTest.Com 'How To' videos for boating, buying and having for sale OYC window stickers, having next year's Change of Watch party in NOV (conversely, having it in DEC), having the End of Summer Olympics at the Shrimpfest... these and other ideas can be presented via email to me or at any of our functions. of not having a brick and mortar facility. So, having more events was seen as a way for members to get together and socialize. One of the ideas that was raised was periodically doing no-host Happy Hours at various locations around the area with the idea of getting people to gather to socialize and get to know more members. So, with that said, I propose the first Friday of every month be a Happy Hour event. To kick it off, Min and I will be at The Electric Palm Friday 2 Jan and Friday 6 Feb at 5:00 PM. On another totally different topic, winter is upon us; and winter can be a good time to get things done on your vessel. BoatUS recommends the following:

- Keep your batteries charging over the winter A trickle charger works great if your boat is on land storage.
- Water Check Periodically inspect your bilges to make sure rain water or snow melting has not filled the bilges, which could result in damage to the bilge pumps.

- Boat Registration great time to get paper work up to date.
- Check the Props if out of the water, it is a good time to inspect and, if necessary, get them tuned.
- Check the anodes replace them now if they are worn by 50%.
- Transducer good time to repair or replace.
- Bottom paint check with your marina/professional and have the bottom repainted before it goes back in the water.
- Take an Online Safety course BoatUS's meets the USCG requirements and it is a great way to keep sharp on boating safety when you are off the water! And it's never too early to sharpen up for The CUP!

Have you ever noticed the above number on the heading of *The Daymarker* and also on the OYC website? This is the OYC group code for the Boat U.S. Cooperating Group

program? As part of the program OYC members can use our group code to receive a 50% discount on their basic annual Boat U.S. membership dues. There is no cost to our club for this membership. We only need to register and keep our members informed as to what Boat U.S. does...

"Boat Owners Association of the United States (Boat U.S.) has been looking after the interests of recreational boat owners for over 45 years. One way that Boat U.S. does this is by forming special relationships with boating and fishing groups. We (they) appreciate your participation in the Boat U.S. and Boat U.S. ANGLER Cooperating Group program, and look forward to working together with you to support better boating and fishing as we continue to help each other grow."
