Ahh, May! It was wonderful seeing everyone at the Flag Raising on 25 April. What a great time! A special thanks to our cooks, our setup and takedown helpers, and of course all of you for helping make the day awesome!

This month is the wine-tasting up at National Harbor ((some boats will be going, some folks will be driving, and some will be out wandering the seas and venturing to far-away harbors (or maybe not so far away) and the Colonial Beach OYC Weekend (Memorial Day weekend) trip. I look forward to spending some nice weekend days and evenings with all attendees!

From my boating notes (I re-read these in the spring before I start my engines):

- Don't forget your anchor; having it loose and ready to drop upon entry into a marina may save you some major repair bills should your transmission or engines malfunction, or should the wind remove any maneuvering capability. Sometimes bow thrusters aren't able to overcome the cross-wind, whereas dropping and dragging an anchor can give you much needed control (you only need to drop enough to drag...not enough to hold you at an anchorage "= 7 x depth").
- Check the steering hydraulic fluid (my fill cap is on the steering column).
- Check the fire extinguishers and test the functioning of your bilge pumps.
- Check the water in your batteries...and check your horn, and your impellers.

- Safety inspection scheduled???
- Remember the importance of the mid-ship line (please note the ACTUAL term below) when undocking; casting off a spring line and making it a mid-ship's line upon departure will allow the crew to cast off the bow and stern yet still keep the boat snug against a pier. When ready, only one line needs to be let go; and if you put a single wrap around a pier or cleat, you can let it go while standing on your boat...no need to attempt to earn the Golden Snorkel by leaping to your swim platform or, as some have demonstrated, hang from the lifeline until such time as your hand gets tired and you drop smartly into the water (although the bystanders will get a kick out of it)...when docking, a midship line gives you the same control as the bow and stern have no choice but to follow the (actual term) Breast Line: A docking line going at approximately a right angle from the boat to the dock, preventing movement away from the dock. Also known as a Waist Line.

- Pat Schondel is busy getting the Send Summer Down Under set up in September to correspond with our Shrimpfest!
- We are looking for cruise coordinators; all of our past-commodores have volunteered to mentor new coordinators. So if you would like to lead a cruise but would like to team with a past-commodore, please send me a note and I'll arrange it.
- Harry Croft is leading a month-long sojourn into the Chesapeake Bay... and many of us have already let him know which day/week we'll be meeting up with him to see the wonderful sights he is planning to show us.
 His trip goes from the Float-In at Point Lookout to the Dog Days party at Aquia Yacht Club.

- Float-In: If you intend to go in July to help us win THE CUP, keep an eye out for a practice session (aka: party) at Jim Dooley's new poolside bar and grill.

There are still a couple of unsent membership checks (send them in soon please). 16 MAY 2015*-10:00 AM to 2:00 PM

Captains and Crews!! Join your fellow recreational boaters on the Occoquan River for a special time-honored tradition when fishermen and seafarers yearned for good fortune and safety in perilous seas...Dedicated to Safety afloat, the Occoquan River Maritime Association (ORMA) is "Launching" the new boating season. The Occoquan community re-invigorated the Blessing of the Fleet in 1999 when the tradition was embraced by marinas, yacht clubs and the ORMA. Invite family and friends to participate in a traditional blessing for safe cruising. *Festive flags and colors are the display of the day.*

HOW DOES IT WORK? Fairfax and Prince William County first responders and law enforcement will lead a procession from Prince William Marina up river to the Town of Occoquan and then parade down river passing a Blessing Boat at Belmont Bay Harbor Marina. <u>Participating vessels should join the parade along</u> <u>the route proceeding outbound to the Blessing Boat and once "blessed";</u> <u>proceed outbound for a safe distance to avoid congestion in the vicinity of the</u> <u>Blessing Boat.</u> The procession will include a Fire Boat other responders and a host vessel with local dignitaries aboard. A NOTAM will be posted.

MAKE IT A FUN DAY!! Join the Parade and have your boat and passengers blessed. Then you are encouraged to visit Tim's River Shore and/or the Electric Palm at Prince William Marina for discounts (10%) **on food purchases. Also, the Merchants Guild of Occoquan (rain or shine) is sponsoring a *Sail Occoquan* event and will be conducting a scavenger hunt using "marine signal flags". A drawing will be held to determine the winner of the scavenger hunt.

ORMA Blessing of the Fleet Past Commodore Livingston

The Occoquan River Maritime Association (ORMA) is sponsoring the **BLESSING OF THE FLEET** on the Occoquan River on **Saturday, the 16th of May from 1000 to 1400**. All recreational vessels are invited to participate in this time honored tradition...fishermen and seafarers from early times sought blessing for safe voyages and return from the perilous dangers of the sea. Decorate you vessels with bright colors and flags and join the parade with your family and friends

The parade will start from the vicinity of Prince William Marina. Initially a fireboat and other first responders will go up river to the basin in front of the Town of Occoquan and then proceed down river to the Belmont Bay Harbor Marina fuel dock. <u>Participating vessels should join</u> <u>the parade behind the responders and a VIP boat in</u> <u>the vicinity</u> <u>of Prince William Marina to the Fairfax</u> <u>Yacht Club</u> and then proceed down river slowly passing a Blessing Vessel docked on Belmont's fuel dock. Your vessels name will be identified and officiating clergy will invoke a blessing on your vessel and passengers. Having been blessed, continue outbound for a safe distance to avoid congestion in the vicinity of the Blessing Vessel.

Like attending our annual Flag Raising and obtaining the CG auxiliary Vessel Safety Check you should attend this event. This year the Merchant's Guild in the Town of Occoquan is participating in this event with a day-long "Sail Occoquan" activity. Participating merchants will display *marine signal flags* creating a scavenger hunt...concluding with a drawing for tickets on the *Miss Rivershore*. In addition to this activity, Tim's River Shore and the Electric Palm/PWM will offer 10% discounts on food for Blessing participants. Bring and show the above flyer to receive the discounts.

ORMA Blessing of the Fleet

May 16. ORMA Blessing of the Fleet - A nautical tradition sponsored by the Occoquan River Maritime Association. This is not a cruise you need to sign up for - just cruise downriver past the Blessing Boat docked alongside the fuel dock at Belmont Bay Marina. The crew of the Spotter Boat will radio the name of your boat to the clergy onboard the Blessing Boat; and as you pass close by, the clergyman will pronounce a blessing upon your vessel for calm seas, fair winds, and safe journeys all season. May 16, 10 a.m. - 2 p.m., (rain date May 17.) The official start of the parade past the Blessing Boat is from Prince William Marina, but captains may simply fall in line as the flotilla, led by the Fairfax County Fire Boat with fountains of water spraying as they go, passes by. If you miss the parade altogether, not to worry - the Blessing Boat will be on station until 2 p.m.

Cruisin' the Chesapeake with Pat and Harry July 19 – August 14. Plan your vacation now! As we near the boating season (yes, it is getting closer!) and in spite of the cold weather, it is time to make your cruising plans! There are many destinations that require some serious cruising, but those do not include Mattawoman Bay or National Harbor. I am talking the BAY!! This season will probably be the last time Pat and I coordinate a Bay trip as we plan to move West to be near two of most beautiful and smartest grandsons in the western hemisphere. Once again we have an ambitious itinerary, 700 miles and about 34 days on the water.

Our cruise will start from the PRYCA Float-in on Sunday, July 19th. If you haven't been to a Float-In yet, you are really missing a premier event. It's a long weekend of great fun, and of course, competition for The Cup! When

the fun has wound down and The Cup is safely back in OYC's possession, we will set off across the Bay. After a month of cruising the Bay, we will head back up the Potomac and end our trip with the Dog Days of August at Aguia Harbor, Aug. 14-16.

Now, I know it is hard for many of you to take off 34 days unless you are retired or have a lot of annual leave to burn up, but you can join us at any point in the cruise for a long week. Most of the places we will visit are reachable within six hours from the Occoquan (that's with a slow boat!). So you can either start off with us from the Float-In, cruising with us as long as you are able, or if you are adventurous enough to cross the Bay on your own, you can join up with us at a later time. The beauty, the splendor, and the history of Chesapeake Bay will provide you with many experiences that only boating can provide.

The plan is flexible and, as always, depends on weather. I have never lost anyone yet!! If the bay is rough, we stay in port another day or two. This cruise will also provide you with an opportunity to really practice your navigation and seamanship skills.

Here are a few of the places we will visit: Onancock, Pocomoke River (this is the most beautiful of all cruising places), Crisfield, Solomons Island, Oxford, St. Michaels, Whitehaven, Salisbury, Chestertown, Rock Hall, Georgetown, Hart Miller Island, Annapolis, and Herrington Harbor. We may also hit Baltimore's Inner Harbor. I try to limit our travel times to 2-3 hours for each segment and stay at least 2 nights at each place. We also plan to be on the hook several nights.

If you can't make any part of this adventure, please have a good reason: "My boat is broken" is the best one. Unacceptable reasons (with retort) include: 1." My boat is too small" (we cruised the entire Bay in a 21' cuddy cabin with a porta-potty, no electronics) 2. "We may get lost" (head either east or west and eventually you will hit land!); 3. "My wife is scared" (come-on now, it's you that is scared!); 4. Foul weather (as I alluded to before, I do not take risks, safety is a nautical imperative); 5. "I have no experience" (this is how you GET IT!). Here is a chance to use all those fancy electronics!!

For those who haven't been on a long cruise with us, there are many details that I will go over in advance to be sure you have a safe and fun time. Remember, you don't have to do the whole 34 days - we can customize a shorter itinerary for whenever you can join us. So, submit those leave requests now!!! If you want a detailed cruise plan, email me and I will forward one to vou, hpcroft@verizon.net. You can also sign up or express interest on the OYC website for cruises.
