Now for the story you have all been waiting for... OYC's participation in the 30th Annual PRYCA Float-In. It all starts with the Float-In practice that Jim and Judy Dooley (Jim is a Past Commodore of OYC) hosted at their home on July 9th from 1pm to 4pm, for which we owe a huge THANK YOU! We had seven boats, and one family in a truck and RV-trailer who participated. Past Commodore Don Bennett and Anne arrived on July 14th. The theme this year was 'Pirates of the Potomac Part II, the Curse of the Blind Dinghy'. OYC floated into the Welcome / Costume dinner party in a homemade pirate ship, the 'Occoquan Pearl II,' and wowed the crowd with our cardboard boating skills and amazing pirates. Awards were given for the best costumes that included OYC wins for best costume: Best Child's (Past Commodore Joe Livingston's grandsons tied), Best Woman's (Vanessa Athena), 3rd place for Best Man's (Pat Schondel), and 3rd place for Best Group. We didn't place in best couple.

Saturday was the big day to focus on The Cup. which we did not win. But we did put in a

herculean effort to achieve a mighty Third Place! The first event was the Seamanship Exam which covers basic navigation, seamanship, general boating safety, and knot tying - the questions were drawn from the US Coast Guard Auxiliary Boating Skills workbook. Our participants were Jay Livingston (Past Commodore Joe Livingston's son) and Michelle Johnson, to whom we owe a great big round of applause and a huge THANK YOU. We had a short lunch break, and then all of our attending members participated in the Scavenger Hunt. We communicated by text, email, and handheld VHF so we could stage our members at their boats to grab any items they had aboard to rush to our central location and then drove all our items up to the service building in the Johnsons' truck. It was a really tough scavenger list this vear, not one team in the entire competition was able to collect all of the items.

For the Blind Dinghy Race we had Dan Kent row with a blindfold on and Allie Cumbey shout the navigating instructions. They did a fantastic job maneuvering from the bulkhead near the registration tent, out to the marker for their first turn, over to the buried pirate booty to snatch their prize, and finally back to the starting point. They only bumped the bulkhead once on their way out and smoothly transited the course the rest of the way in a great time. Give them a big thanks!!!

In the Rescue by Life Ring at the pool we were required to have a female throw the ring to rescue a male victim. I was the victim for this event and treaded water at the far end of the pool in deep water. I was happy to be wearing a life jacket. We had my fiancé Vanessa Athena be the rescuer who had to throw the ring to save me. She did a really good job and didn't hit me in the head, which I'm sure was a thought that crossed her mind... hahaha. Next time we are all at happy hour giver Vanessa a big thanks and see if she didn't have that thought.

The last event was the Rescue by Dinghy at the pool, which also required a female rescuer and a male victim. We had Ilana Cumbey paddle the dinghy across the pool to rescue the victim Alex Livingston (Past Commodore Joe Livingston's grandson). Please give Ilana and Alex a big hearty thank you when you have a chance to see them.

And a great big thank you and kudos to the PRYCA Board who did an outstanding job planning and executing this event. Also, Point Lookout's crew worked tirelessly day and night to anticipate and fulfill our every need. A huge thank you to them all for all their hard work! even had several vessels at the Mount Vernon fireworks on 9 July. OYC had a good turnout for the PRYCA Float-In 15-17 July, and congratulations on the third place finish given the number of vessels that had to cancel due to problems of one sort or another. And Pat and Harry Croft's Chesapeake Bay cruise is now well under way, and we wish them and their fellow cruisers the best of times and safe passage on their cruise.

We want to continue to emphasize safety! When summer storms pop up, you need to be prepared to break away from a raft-up and/or make sure your anchor is set well. On one weekend in July, there were several reports of calls for assistance because the storm came up so fast that all the boats in Mattawoman Creek dragged to shallower waters, and some ran aground. We had one OYC member that had an engine compartment fire. Luckily they were able to call for assistance; but if they had not been able, having someone expecting you could save your life. Make sure you file a float plan before heading out on a trip and be sure to update it. Not sure what a float plan is? Go to the USCG Auxiliary website on float plans and learn about them http://floatplancentral.cgaux.org. It is basically a plan giving your vessel information, where you are going and when you expect to get there/return. See the USCG Aux Float Plan attachedto this email for your convenience. Boating Safety is a Must!

Be Weather-Wise

Always check local weather conditions before departure; TV and radio forecasts can be a good source of information. If you notice darkening clouds, volatile and rough changing winds or sudden drops in temperature, play it safe by getting off the water.

Follow a Pre-Departure Checklist

Proper boating safety includes being prepared for any possibility on the water. Following a pre-departure checklist is the best way to make sure no boating safety rules or precautions have been overlooked or forgotten.

Use Common Sense

One of the most important parts of boating safety is to use your common sense. This means operating at a safe speed at all times (especially in crowded areas), staying alert at all times and steering clear of large vessels and watercraft that can be restricted in their ability to stop or turn. Also, be respectful of buoys and other navigational aids, all of which have been placed there to ensure your own safety.

Designate an Assistant Skipper

Make sure more than one person on board is familiar with all aspects of your boat's handling, operations, and general boating safety. If the primary navigator is injured or incapacitated in any way, it's important to make sure someone else can follow the proper boating safety rules to get everyone else back to shore.

Develop a Float Plan

Whether you choose to inform a family member or staff at your local marina, always be sure to let someone else know your float plan. This should include where you're going and how long you're going to be gone.

A float plan can include the following information:

- o name, address, and phone number of trip leader
- o name and phone number of all passengers
- boat type and registration information 0
- o trip itinerary
- o types of communication and signal equipment onboard, such as an Emergency Position Indicating Radio Beacon (EPIRB) or Personal Locator Beacon (PLB)

Make Proper Use of Lifejackets

Did you know that the majority of drowning victims are the result of boaters not wearing their lifeiackets? Make sure that your family and friends aren't part of this statistic by assigning and fitting each member of your onboard team with a life jacket prior to departure. Wear it!

Avoid Alcohol

Practice boating safety at all times by saving the alcohol for later. The probability of being involved in a boating accident doubles when alcohol is involved, and studies have shown that the effects of alcohol are exacerbated by sun and wind.

Learn to Swim

If you're going to be in and around the water, proper boating safety includes knowing how to swim. Local organizations, such as the American Red Cross and others, offer training for all ages and abilities. Check to see what classes are offered in your area.

Take a Boating Course

Beginning boaters and experienced experts alike need to be familiar with the boating safety rules of operation. Boater education requirements vary by state; however, some require validated completion of at least one boating safety course. Regardless of your individual state's requirements, it's always important to be educated and prepared for every circumstance that might arise. You can learn boating safety rules by taking a local community course or online course to help educate yourself.

Consider a Free Vessel Safety Check

Take advantage of a free vessel safety check from the US Coast Guard. They offer complimentary boat examinations to verify the presence and condition of certain safety equipment required by state and federal regulations. Free of charge, they'll provide a specialist to check out your boat and make helpful boating safety tips and recommendations. They also offer virtual online safety checks as well.

Flag Poles and Mounts

Contact PC Joe Livingston

Members,

The poles are designed to fly a 12" club burgee and are made of solid machined 316 stainless steel with rotating clips and a machined iodized aluminum mount that holds the unit to the rail of your vessel.

The Swiveler flag pole and mount I currently have available is the one-inch size (3 remaining). I will take orders for other sizes; and depending on number of requests, I will send in one more orders this season. Price remains \$65 per set for the 19" 316 Stainless pole and the anodized aluminum mount milled to specific diameter.

To order for your vessel, send me an email and indicate how many sets you wish to purchase, indicating the exact diameter of your rail (measure...do not guess). I find it easiest to use an adjustable wrench slid over the rail and then measure the opening of the wrench. Many rails are 1", 1-1/8", or 1-1/4" in diameter, and size does matter for a good fit. As said, the cost of each set is \$65.00 payable to Joe Livingston. Please contact me at joseph.livingston@verizon.net or by cell at 703-505-8313.

LaLa's Para'Dice with Greg and Ilana, and Bergie with Les and Kathy. Many of the boats joined on Friday evening and we cooked up some good BBQ. On Saturday, we started with some breakfast, but then Bud and Chris had to go to the doggie ER to get one of the pooches checked on...all turned out ok. The remainder of the day was spent relaxing on the floatees and sharing Cubi-Specials (rum drinks). The BBQ was utilized throughout the day and evening and the tides and winds made sure the boats remained oriented to the fireworks. And what a nice show it was! When it was over we relaxed into the wee hours of the morning, then retired to a calm night on the Potomac. Overall, I will likely recommend having two rafts next year—one for those wanting to be closer to Tim's and one for those wanting to be farther away.
