#### Commodore's Log, mid-spring 2016 – Hi everybody I'm

**2016** – Hi, everybody. I'm cruising down the Potomac on my way to have *RhumbLine* hauled for propeller work, bottom painting, zincs, and gelcoat inspection for those pesky PolyesterMites. Well, okay, I

caught a few of you from the *Maydarker* with my PolyesterMite story. So I'm not really dealing with them – but I do have a lot of work to finalize preparations for the season. I hope all of you have less in front of you than I do. I don't wish my situation on anybody! Anyway, as we come up on the OYC Flag Raising of May 7<sup>th</sup>, it is a good time to reflect on the de-winterizing completed and any other work yet to do. Don't forget, on May 6<sup>th</sup> we'll also have our regular OYC Happy Hour of the first Friday of the month at Belmont Bay behind Hi-Jinx III on E-Dock.

Here are some notes that might be helpful from Immediate Past Commodore Bud Bishop about preparing for the season: Don't forget your anchor. Having it loose and ready to drop upon entry into a marina may save you some major repair bills should your transmission or engines malfunction or should the wind remove any maneuvering capability. Sometimes bow thrusters aren't able to overcome the crosswind; whereas dropping and dragging an anchor can give you much needed control (you only need to drop enough to drag...not enough to hold you at an anchorage, which is rode length of seven times your depth in feet). Check your steering hydraulic fluid. Check your fire extinguishers and test the functioning of your bilge pumps. Check the water in your batteries unless you have gel batteries. And check your horn, and your impellers. On this set of notes, don't forget to schedule your boat inspection – it is best to get it done every year!

Bud also has a good set of notes from the past on boat handling: Remember the importance of the mid-ship line (please note, the ACTUAL term) when undocking. Casting off a spring line and making it a mid-ship's line upon departure will allow the crew to cast off the bow and stern, yet still keep the boat snug against a pier. When ready, only one line needs to be let go; and if you put a single wrap around a pier or cleat, you can let it go while standing on your boat...no need to attempt to earn the Golden Snorkel by leaping to your swim platform, or as some have demonstrated, hang from the lifeline until such time as your hand gets tired and you drop smartly into the water (although the bystanders will get a kick out of it). When docking, a mid-ship line gives you the same control as the bow and stern and it is actually called a Breast Line. A docking line going at approximately a right angle from the boat to the dock, preventing movement away from the dock, is known as a Waist Line.

As I was writing I received several emails from folks who participated in the Early Bird Cruise to National Harbor and the wine-tasting festivities that occurred there this past weekend (4/22-4/24). I'm not exactly sure how many ended up going but it sounds like a great time was had by all. Thanks to Wayne Beal, our Cruise Coordinator (and OYC Membership Chair), for pulling the event together. Look for articles in this month's *Daymarker* that highlight that event! I look forward to talking to everybody at the OYC Flag Raising (May 7<sup>th</sup> at Occoquan Harbor Marina) about how their experiences have gone so far this year! On that note, I have been in contact with many of our local elected officials and members of Congress who are working on their schedules to come meet us, speak with us, and share some thoughts with us about their efforts on our behalf.

A couple of closing notes: Bud has volunteered to train a new cadre of navigation test takers for the PRYCA Float-In that include: Bud, Bob Hill (Vice Commodore), and yours truly – me. We are still recruiting ladies to be test takers to complement my wife-to-be, Vanessa, (November 5<sup>th</sup> in Las Vegas at the Bellagio) and hopefully Suzy Tarasek (this may be her first hint of that role). Please feel free to volunteer - any and all, Please! If you intend to go in July to help us win THE CUP, keep an eye out for a practice session (aka, party) at Jim Dooley's new poolside bar and grill. And we are looking for cruise coordinators; all of our past commodores have volunteered to mentor new coordinators. So if you would like to lead a cruise but would like to team with a past-commodore, please send me a note and I'll arrange it.

Is your boat seaworthy? Are you familiar with the definition of seaworthiness and the federal requirements for recreational boat owners and operators? While there are no fixed criteria setting the standard for a vessel's seaworthiness, an annual U.S Coast Guard vessel safety check is required and is your first step toward

safe boating. Schedule your annual safety check soon, U.S. Coast Guard approved vessel examiners will also be available at OHM at our May 7<sup>th</sup> Flag Raising event. Check out <u>http://www.uscgboating.org/images/420.PDF</u> Take advantage of this FREE service, and schedule your safety check now. It could save your boat and a life. A vessel safety decal is required to participate in all OYC raft-ups, no exceptions.

While spring commissioning has already started for most of us, the official start of the OYC boating season will be commemorated at our OYC Flag Raising ceremony on Saturday May 7<sup>th</sup> starting at 12 noon at Occoquan Harbour Marina. Please plan to attend this annual OYC event. We invited several dignitaries and our National Anthem will be concluded with cannon fire provided by Past Commodore and Marine Corps veteran Don Bennett. ### **Boating Safety Starts With You!**

#### Alcohol and Boating Think Before You Drink!

Almost half of all boating accidents involve alcohol. That should be reason enough to leave alcohol consumption for

when you are safely ashore or at anchor with no plans to travel.

Operating a boat while intoxicated is a federal offense, subject to a \$1,000 fine. In addition, criminal penalties are as high as \$5,000, and may even include jail time. State Boating Under the Influence (BUI) Laws are becoming more stringent too. In most states, the standards for determining whether an individual is intoxicated matches its state highway laws for operating a vehicle. Please consider:

- In most states it is illegal to operate a boat with a blood alcohol content of .08% or greater.
- Some states will suspend your boating license or privilege.
- In some states your driving record could be affected.
- Your boat could be seized or sold at auction.

Sobering Man-Over-Board Facts

- 24% are characterized as "falls overboard"
- 24% die at night, 76% die in daylight
- 63% do not know how to swim
- 8% of non-swimmers wear a life jacket
- 90% occur in calm weather with < 1' chop
- 85% are men
- The average age of a MOB is 47 years old
  - Alcohol consumption plays a part in
    - 27% of daylight deaths
    - 50% of nighttime deaths

#### **Flag Poles and Mounts**

#### Members,

The poles are designed to fly a 12" club burgee and are made of solid machined 316 stainless steel with rotating clips and a machined iodized aluminum mount that holds the unit to the rail of your vessel.

The Swiveler flag pole and mount I currently have available is the one-inch size (3 remaining). I will take orders for other sizes; and depending on number of requests, I will send in one more orders this season. Price remains \$65 per set for the 19" 316 Stainless pole and the anodized aluminum mount milled to specific diameter.

To order for your vessel, send me an email and indicate how many sets you wish to purchase, indicating the exact diameter of your rail (measure...do not guess). I find it easiest to use an adjustable wrench slid over the rail and then measure the opening of the wrench. Many rails are 1", 1-1/8", or 1-1/4" in diameter, and size does matter for a good fit. As said, the cost of each set is \$65.00 payable to Joe Livingston. Please contact me at joseph.livingston@verizon.net or by cell at 703-505-8313.

# Tuna Fishing

I just returned from a fifteen day fishing trip where, at the farthest point from San Diego, we were approximately 450 miles SW of Cabo San Lucas.

The trip to the fishing grounds takes four days of day/night travel. This means on a fifteen day trip you fish for seven full days. When we got to the fishing grounds the captain said "sleep is over, you can sleep on the way home" - how profound this statement became.

We fished two areas off Mexico one called the Hurricane Bank and one called Clarion Island (where we had to check in with the Mexican Navy - very interesting). We'd leave the anchorage at 330am each fishing morning, motor about an hour to the fishing grounds, and have our lines wet by 5am. There were two bites each day - a bite meaning 4-5 people were going to be hooked up at the same time. Those bites were from 530 - 9am and 430 - 7pm. The bites occurred like clockwork - simply amazing. That said the times surrounding "the bite" you had to have a line in the water because that's the only way you're going to catch a fish - and fish were being caught.

The time between 10am and 4pm was brutal trying to stay vigilant, "in the game," after getting up early, fighting fish, and now enduring sweltering heat. Mix in massive, slow rolling, fifteen-foot ground swells and you relished when the captain decided to go trolling for wahoo.

Around 7pm we'd have dinner while headed back to the anchorage and then, make the dreaded bait (tube mackerel which the tuna find irresistible) until 11pm and then, after 4+ hours of sleep, the fishing day would begin again.

YFT is "stand up" fishing - no chair, no harness, and no quarter. The boat rail was your best friend as you made every attempt to keep the line straight, taught, and a bend in the rod. As the fish ranged from 125 lbs to 265 lbs it typically took an hour, often longer, to bring the fish to gaff. If you rushed the fight by not letting the drag tire the fish and/or your terminal tackle was not 200% GTG all to often, notwithstanding a long fight, you lost the fish.

The M/S Independence is 110' x 30' @ 225,000 lbs. Seems pretty large but with 21 fisherman and 8 crew it gets plenty cozy through 15 days. Throw in multiple hook-ups of +150 yellow fin tuna (YFT) and plenty of speedy wahoo and we're talking about nothing short of a contact sport.



Many folks lost fish and you saw all ranges of emotions.

For myself I'm told I did good by catching nine and boating six YFT. Those six YFT yielded 350 lbs of processed fillets – simply unimaginable!

The fish is truly a magnificent beast deserving our responsible use of the meat you keep. The fight is simply narcotic. After an hour you're babbling goo and then an hour after that you're at the rail desperate for more adrenaline.

Ironically, something that is anything but a plush vacation becomes an event you can't get out of your mind.——Mikey
