Looking for Flag Pole Mounts??? By Joe Livingston of the Gail Lynn II

The Swiveler Flag Pole set design fits our Club's 12" burgee and the pole is mad of solid machined 316 stainless steel, with rotating clips, and the mount is machined iodized aluminum. Ask Club members what they thing of this flag pole and review at www.originalswiveler.com.

To order, send me an email indicating how many sets you want and give the exact diameter of your rail (please measure...do not guess). Use an adjustable wrench slid over the rail and then measure that opening in inches. Many rails are 1", 1-1/8" or 1-1/4".

Back in April, Gov McAuliffe put the brakes on Dominion Power's Coal Ash plans pending a study. That study is release next week on 4 December. Stay tuned for the results and if you find yourself in Richmond, it's in the State Capitol, Rm #1, 1000 Bank St, Richmond, VA. Related to clean water, the Water Control Board will hold hearings to consider the applica-



tion for water quality certification for the Atlantic Coast Pipeline. Hearings are scheduled for Monday and Tuesday, 11 & 12 December. Finally, There's a public meeting on the water permit for the Potomac River pipeline, Tuesday, 19 Dec, 6pm at Hancock School, 289 W. Main St., Hancock, MD.

Ever wonder why we're in the Chesapeake Bay Yacht Club Association? Well...let me tell you. The CBYCA was an instrumental advocate to kill E15 in our tanks. Corn is the last thing any self-respecting Chevy 454 Big Block, 4 barrel carburetor owner would ever want to see in their fuel...
