With so many warm days in the 70's and one or two in the 80's me and Vanessa are really excited about the upcoming cruising season. I thought I would share with all of you the fun time had by many of our OYC members at the Annual Potomac River Yacht Clubs Association (PRYCA) Change of Watch in January. The PRYCA is an association of approximately 24 yacht clubs up and down the river that has been in existence over 45 years after having its first meeting in 1971. Well, the website says 21 clubs, but two new member clubs were added last year and another is being considered this year - so it is at least 23 and likely to become 24 this year. We'll recommend that their web page be updated. Anyway, OYC is a member club of PRYCA which has many of the same goals and objectives we do. PRYCA's purpose as stated on their website is to:

- Encourage yachting and boating safety

Clean That Bottom

Ever see a picture of an Iceberg? Looks beautiful on top right? Well, some may think so, but there is a lot going on just below the waterline.

Slime, algae, barnacles and Zebra mussels are only some of the things that can attach to your boat bottom. Collectively this is referred to as Fouling. Besides being unsightly, fouling growth can increase the roughness of the hull, decreasing the vessel's performance and maneuverability, increasing drag, reducing speed and increasing fuel consumption. If left unattended, fouling leads to corrosion of the hull and to the vessel's deterioration. In high growth areas, it is common to hire divers to scrub the bottom of your boat every few weeks, even though you may have antifouling paint on the bottom.

Fouling begins with the attachment of bacteria. It attaches to almost everything and when conditions are right proceeds to grow and multiply. It can appear as a slimy surface or can grow in a polymeric fashion to mimic hair or grass. It can be many different colors from blue green to brown or red.

Once this slimy biofilm of bacteria attaches to the hull, more advanced life forms begin to attach, such as algae, protozoan, sea weeds, barnacles, mussels, sea squirts, tube worms and more. Each higher life form feeds on the more primitive and is attracted by the "Food" on your boat's bottom. One of the reasons for not putting conventional carnauba based waxes on

your bottom is that bacteria and algae feed on, and are attracted to it.

You have a couple of ways to clean the fouling from your boat. One, you will first have to haul it and move it on land, away from the water's edge. Short hauls could cost you \$8 a foot plus \$220. You will then need a pressure washer, wash as much of the growth off, as you can, while the fouling is still wet. This Pressure wash could cost you anywhere from \$150-\$175. Now if you need anti-fouling paint, marina's will charge anywhere between \$1800 and \$2200.

If you have recently (within the last year) had your bottom painted you may only need a good scrubbing. If you are like me, and have not removed your boat from the water in the past 2 years, you may need to do a short haul and get it pressured washed.

If you only need a scrubbing (hull, drive shafts, props, rudders, etc), I am a certified diver and am available most weekends (starting in April) for a fee is \$3.00 per foot, saving you tons on a short haul. Just give me a call at 202-525-9985 to set up a date.

Have a safe and enjoyable boating season coming up.

Looking for Flag Poles and Mounts???

Still have the Swiveler Flag Pole set which is designed to fly the club's 12" burgee. Many of our members consider this flag pole the best on the market; and the solid machined 316 stainless steel pole, with rotating clips and machined iodized aluminum mount, securely holds and protects the flag. Review at www.originalswiveler.com.

Each set costs \$65, and the mount is milled to a specific diameter. To order, send me an email indicating how many sets you wish to purchase, give the exact diameter of you rail (measure please...do not guess). I find it easiest to use an adjustable wrench slid over the rail and then measure that opening in inches. Many rails are 1", 1-1/8", or 1-1/4" in diameter. Sets are currently available.

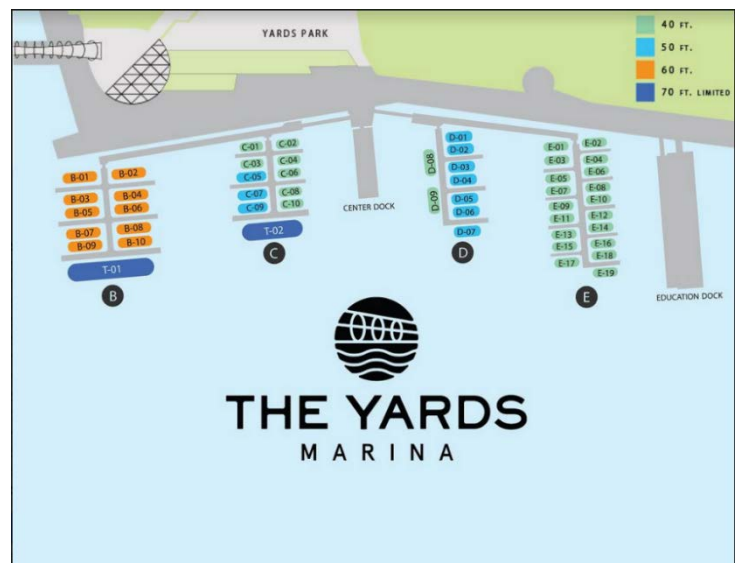
