Rafting up with other boats and friends is fun and one of the great pleasures of boating, but keep in mind there are unwritten rules of rafting up etiquette that every boater should know and follow. Safety and common courtesy considerations when rafting up is a must. Adequate and proper preparation is key for successful rafting. While there are no specific USCG regulations that address pleasure boat rafting, there are how to tips I was able to find in several Boating Magazine articles. While not inclusive, please see the following tips below, and enjoy.

• When initiating a raft-up, know that it's acceptable to ask, and to be asked, to join. Monitor VHF channel 16, fly your OYC burgee, and ensure you have a USCG Auxiliary Vessel Safety Inspection.

- Hail and request your fellow boaters to join the raft-up. Approval to join is at the discretion of each Captain in the raft-up, especially the Captain that you will raft alongside. Don't be disappointed if you're denied, just drop your own anchor and start your own raft up.
- Typically the heaviest boat sets the first anchor, her anchor will usually have the highest holding power.
- The joining vessels should deploy her lines and fenders ahead of time. Use plenty of fenders (only cars have bumpers) and make sure they're big enough and set to keep the rafted boats from touching.
- Plan to tie up to a boat that is similar in size both for ease in crossing from one boat to another and for matching up fender heights to help prevent squeezing. When possible, try to get the sterns of

the boats to line up so people can pass from vessel to vessel on the swim platforms. This is safer and more practical than climbing across gunwales or over bow rails. Use spring lines to adjust fore and aft position relative to the adjacent vessel.

• Approach slowly into position from behind, being careful to watch for swimmers, other boaters and water sports enthusiasts. Come abeam to the host vessel. Heave (throw) the bow and stern lines to the other crew. If you can't do this due to

wind and current, approach the bow at a 45-degree angle and toss the bowline, and allow your boat to settle gently back and beside the host by using the wind or current or slow reverse engine maneuvers. Practice throwing lines with your First Mate, it's fun and essential to safe rafting.

- Tie bow, stern, and spring lines onto the adjacent boat. Lines and fenders should be checked regularly during the raft-up to ensure tension and position.
- If more than two boats are rafting up, the anchored boat should remain in the middle. If more boats continue to tie up, alternate each arriving vessel so that the numbers remain the same on each side of the first anchored vessel.
- If you are joining the raft up and you are requested to drop an anchor (every 3rd boat in the line should have an anchor), move up past the line at least 2 boat lengths, depending on the water depth, drop anchor, reverse, and back into position, ensuring tension on the anchor rode.
- As any good boater should, always keep an eye on the weather, in case you need to depart or break the raft.

• When you're leaving the raft-up, announce to all your intentions, ensure there are no swimmers or lines in the water, and conduct one last visual check before starting your main engines.

Soon, we'll drop anchor at Mattawoman Creek, fire up our swim platform grill, crack a cold one, and take a dip with our noodles. Come Join. Cheers.

If my boat is Federally Documented, does it still need to be register with a state?

So I have been asked by a few who have seen my boat why I didn't have State numbers on the side. I get boarded quite often by local Fairfax and Prince William boating Police because of this also, but I welcome their do diligence. Normally they board me and ask immediately if my boat is Federally Documented through the U.S. Coast Guard, which I answer Yes and provide them the required documentation stating so. I never get anymore grief. They say thank you and are usually on their way (they might look around a little bit before they go and there is the typical how much have you been drinking today but...) lol.

I did a little research to try to find you all an answer, other than my word, and I have located the following information from the BoatUS website:

"Generally, yes. For those who keep their boats primarily in U.S. waters, federal documentation in no way replaces state registration, nor does it exempt boat owners from complying with state laws. In fact, most states require documented vessels kept in state waters for a certain period of time to register and get a state sticker to indicate that the required state taxes have been paid. However, a state cannot require you to carry state numbers, as a documented vessel already has federal numbers.

Documentation is a federal (U.S. only) form of registering a boat with the U.S. Coast Guard and is preferred by many lending institutions because it is currently the only way to get a Preferred Ship's Mortgage. This type of mortgage for a boat loan allows the recording of a lien against the boat (not the person). Documentation as a vessel of the U.S. is also useful for those who plan to spend time cruising in foreign countries.

In order to qualify for documentation, a recreational vessel must be at least five net tons (usually 25 feet or more) and be wholly owned by a U.S. citizen. Any vessel put into commercial service in the U.S. must also be documented. In order to receive the Coast Guard's "Coastwise" (commercial) endorsement, the vessel must also be American-built.

Within a few years, the federal Vessel Identification System (VIS) will allow participating states to also offer Preferred Ship's Mortgages. It will be a national database of state registered and titled boats and will be a great anti-theft mechanism for marine police, insurers and boaters. BoatUS has supported VIS for many years."

Now, I have been asked why I have not yet registered my vessel with the State and I usually counter with the Question "What does Certain amount of time" mean (from the first paragraph) and they normally don't have an answer for that, without making it up themselves.

What I'm gathering from this is VA State just wants to make sure they are getting more of our monies in taxes (end game that I see) but me also being Active Duty, I don't pay taxes in VA. That might also play a factor into them not messing me too.

Just wanted to get a better, more educated answer out to those who have asked me this question also.

Best Boating Apps.

The year is 2017 and yet some of us absolutely, positively, undoubtedly refuse to use anything but the ol' paper maps, telescope and constellations. BUT, if you are one of those that are current with the times and have a smartphone, here are some great apps to have at your disposal:



This is a really popular App boaters are using to track themselves on the water and can be downloaded from the Itunes or Google Stores. I prefer using:



i-Boating: Nautical / Marine Charts & Fishing Maps

I use this app in addition to my broken radar (yes, you read that correctly. It turns on and you see a green screen, but that's about all you see). This app has an Auto Follow function, shows you all the buoys and travel lanes, speed and heading, allows you to plot routes or add way points and so much more.

I used this app while driving Greg and Ilana's boat back from DC in absolute zero visibility because of fog and no moon one night. It insured we were safely in the middle of the channel at all times and helped us look for the next buoy... life saver!

MyRadar Weather Radar

This app shows animated weather, so you can tell if rain is headed toward or away from you, and how fast. In addition to the free features of the app, a few additional upgrades are available; see severe storm warnings for your area, as provided by the National Weather Service, and real-time hurricane tracking - great for the start of hurricane season! The map has the standard pinch/zoom capability which allows you to smoothly zoom and pan around the United States and see what the weather is like anywhere.



Animated Knots by Grog is a broad teaching and reference tool for boaters and other hobbyists. With step-by-step instructions and, you guessed it, frame-byframe animations, this app teaches you to tie knots at your own pace.



FishingScout

A great resource and social app for anglers. The app allows you to upload photos of your latest catch, describe the conditions of how you caught it, study other locations where fish were caught, add friends, view their photos and more.

Or you can do like Greg Cumby and I do, drop a pole at the docks, drown a worm while we partake in a nice cold beverage! If we lose the pole we know we got a bite!



Now I have not personally used this app yet but I will be downloading it and giving it a try.

The Dockwa app allows boaters to view marinas in their location, select a destination and request a slip or mooring, all from their mobile device. Once the marina approves the reservation, payment is processed seamlessly through the app.



Boatrax

Another app I currently do not have but will be downloading and giving it a try. Boatrax lets you keep detailed records of your boat while capturing and sharing your moments with family and friends. You can share your location and photos with friends and the boating community.



Boatrax helps you stay organized by managing everything you need to create the ultimate boating experience, including your expenses and services. Include your crew members in your boating excursion by allowing them access to manage everything on your checklist.

Last month, I mentioned how important your individual voice is when coupled with effective club advocacy. If you follow the FB page, you'll see 2 recent examples of how powerful that combination can be as Gov McAuliffe signed legislation that curtailed use of Coal Ash ponds, as well as Alexandria city sewage dumping into the Potomac. (ewww...)

If you've ever followed the National Boating Federation (n-b-f.org), you'll see Earl Waesche's name, he is the NBF Legislative Director. I've included 2 of his excerpts here. As always, if you feel moved, please contact your Congressman or woman, you can have an impact!

President Trump's Budget Blueprint and Potential to Recreational Boating: "... President Trump's FY 2018 Budget Blueprint was recently released, with full budget details expected in May. The FY2018 budget, if enacted, would offset a ten percent increase in defense spending (\$603 billion) with a ten percent decrease in nondefense spending (\$462 billion), which includes a \$1.5 billion (11.7 percent) decrease for the Department of Interior (DOI), a \$1 billion cut for the Army Corps of Engineers (16.3 percent), and a reduction of \$2.6 billion (31.4 percent) for the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). All of these departments, have a significant impact on the recreational boating."

Update on the Renewable Fuel Standard Reform Act, H.R. 1315: "...the RFS Reform Act, as introduced by Congressman Goodlatte (R-VA), had four cosponsors. The bill now has 47 bipartisan cosponsors and is still assigned to the House Energy and Commerce Committee. This definitely increases the chance of passage. The bill has yet

to be introduced in the Senate. H.R. 1315 caps the amount of ethanol that can be in our gasoline at 10%."

Rear Commodore Wayne Beal mentioned the Colonial Beach Memorial Day Weekend cruise. As you may have heard, a severe storm battered Colonial Beach with violent gusts and hail on Friday evening, 21 April. While there were no indications of a tornado, winds blew out of the thunderstorm in a straight line and were measured at 70-75 mph. In addition to the powerful gusts, quarter- to half-dollar sized hail pelted the town at the height of the storm and plastered the streets and cars with leaves. While the storm didn't spawn a tornado, intense winds had a similar effect. As a result, damage throughout the town was extensive, with dozens of large trees uprooted and trailers and boat shelters destroyed.

Sadly, the Colonial Beach Yacht Center (CBYC), our destination for the Memorial Day Weekend cruise, did not escape the wrath of the storm. Wayne and I spoke with the Dock Master, Mark Hunter, to get an initial assessment of the damage. Mr. Hunter reported that the marina had sustained "significant damage" and that they were only just now beginning the process of submitting insurance claims and arranging for repair work that will require at the very least several months to complete. We are currently evaluating our options and will keep all those who have signed up for the Colonial Beach cruise apprised of developments.

The Swiveler Flag Pole set is designed to fly the club's 12 " burgee. Many of our members consider this flag pole the best on the market; and the solid machined 316 stainless steel pole, with rotating clips and machined iodized aluminum mount, securely holds and protects the flag. Review at <u>www.originalswiveler.com</u>.

Each set costs \$65, and the mount is milled to a specific diameter. To order, send me an email indicating how many sets you wish to purchase, give the exact diameter of you rail (measure please...do not guess). I find it easiest to use an adjustable wrench slid over the rail and then measure that opening in inches. Many rails are 1", 1-1/8", or 1-1/4" in diameter. Sets are currently available.
