As winter approaches and our boats are gradually put into hibernation (sniff...), there's been a few updates on the legislative front for you. First, our worst corn nightmares have come true, as E15 is now authorized for yearround use. If you buy your gas at the pump, say for an outboard, then please check the Ethanol content before you pump! The National Boating Federation has grave concerns about the damage E15 will do to marine engines. Biobutanol, a friendly alternative, won't likely be available at the gas station pumps, but hopefully more marinas will carry it soon.

For those of you who have outfitted your yacht with LED's, beware of a growing concern of interference with VHF, particularly if located near your antenna. The U.S. Coast Guard, Office of Investigation and Analysis, issued a Marine Safety Alert, 13-18, to alert mariners about reports regarding poor reception on various frequencies of their VHF radio. This happens when the radio is used for calling, automatic identification system (AIS) and digital selective calling (DSC) when in the vicinity of light emitting diode (LED) on-board ships (e.g. navigation lights, searchlights and floodlights and interior and exterior lights). Radio frequency interference caused by these LED lights was found to create potential safety hazards. The Coast Guard has received many reports from crews, ship owners, inspectors and other mariners regarding this very significant problem. Recreational boaters should use caution when they are near ships that have LED lights. For example, the maritime rescue coordination center in one port was unable to contact a ship involved in a traffic separation scheme incident by VHF radio. LED lights installed near VHF antennas have compounded the reception.

Finally, some good news...President Trump signed the Save Our Seas Act into law, which allows for the NOAA Administrator to declare a severe marine debris event and will enable the authorization of funds to states for cleanup and response efforts. Senator Whitehouse stated, "We're dealing with a problem that is so serious. The estimate is that if we don't get after it by 2050, which isn't that far away in the grand scheme of things, there will actually be more waste plastic in the ocean than living fish. That is not the kind of world we want to leave to our grandchildren and getting to work on this is really important." There will be \$10 million dollars in new funding each year for five years. Senator Sullivan pointed out that "Ocean debris and the plastics that break down into micro-particles that get into the food chain is a real challenge and we're not even fully understanding how that negatively impact, not just the fisheries, but even human health." He also lauded the large bipartisan effort and collaboration on the bill. And lastly, please take a look at https://www.dcwater.com/cleanrivers. It's another worthwhile effort to clean up our favorite rivers, so please do what you can to support their efforts...particularly the tunnels project. Remember that the individual voices carry more weight than just Associations and Clubs do alone!

The Swiveler Flag Pole Set design fits our Club's 12" burgee and the pole is made of solid machined 316 stainless steel, with rotating clips. The mount is machined iodized aluminum. Ask Club members what they think of this flag pole or review at www.originalswiveler.com.

To order, send me an email indicating how many sets you want and give the exact diameter of your rail (please measure...do not guess) Use an adjustable wrench slid over the rail and then measure that opening in inches. Many rails are 1", 1-1/8" or 1-1/4".

























Seaweed Noodle salad; 1/2 cup Dried Wakame (seaweed); 2 batches Rice Noodles (1 package usually has 4 batches); 1 cucumber; 1 cup imitation crab meat; 1/2 cup red & yellow peppers; 1 tsp beef soup stock - powder; 1/2 cup sushi vinegar; 4 pkg equal or 1 tbsp sugar; 1 tbsp soy sauce, and 1 tbsp sesame oil.

Soak dried seaweed in warm water until it doubles in size, drain water. Put rice noodle in boiling water for 5 minutes or until soft, drain than rinse in cold water, drain repeat until the noodles are cold. Chop cucumbers and peppers. Put drained seaweed, rice noodles, cucumbers, peppers, crab meat in a bowl and mix. Put rest of ingredients into bowl and mix. You can add more vinegar, soup stock, soy sauce, etc to adjust to your taste buds, this dish is best served cold.
