

The Swiveler Flag Pole Set design fits our Club's 12" burgee and the pole is made of solid machined 316 stainless steel, with rotating clips. The mount is machined iodized aluminum. Ask Club members what they think of this flag pole or review at www.originalswiveler.com.

To order, send me an email indicating how many sets you want and give the exact diameter of your rail (please measure...do not guess) Use an adjustable wrench slid over the rail and then measure that opening in inches. Many rails are 1", 1-1/8" or 1-1/4".



Hello fellow OYC members!

As your membership chair, every once in awhile I take a look at our club By-Laws on the website to learn or remind myself of things I've forgotten or didn't know. One item I'd

like to pass to every member is that if you've met anyone at your docks this year or know of anyone that might be interested in joining our club, October 1st is the perfect time to do it. Per the ByLaws:

Article III, para 3a, The fiscal year, and membership year of this organization shall be from January 1 to December 31 of that calendar year. The Membership Chairman, at the direction of the Executive Board, may begin issuing new memberships for an up-coming membership year within a period not to exceed 90 days prior to the beginning of that membership year. Such persons issued Regular Memberships shall be eligible to vote at any scheduled General Membership Meeting.

Simply put, this means that anyone that joins our club on October 1st receives the benefit of 15 months of membership (example: 1 Oct 2019 - 31 Dec 2020) which entitles them to attend any of our upcoming events including the COW.

Since we are a virtual club, the way to join is to log into occoquanyachtclub.com and fill out the online application. Once payment is received, normally within 24 hours, they are an official member of the club. Remember, owning a boat is NOT a requirement of our club. We currently have several members that don't own a boat but they still want to be a part of our club and that entitles them to enjoy land events and attend meetings. These members are our Associate members. If you have any questions about membership please don't hesitate to ask me.
