We had a wonderful trip to Crisfield, Onancock, Cape Charles, Tides Inn, and for some, even an excursion to Rudee Inlet. I'm happy to say the COVID Cruise was a success. As it always is that time of year, it was brutally hot, and although the timing didn't work out for some of the nice restaurants, the pools were open! Fishing wasn't great, but the crew of Miss Nicole (including Nicole herself!) treated us great and the beer was cold. 

Beer Dip

Ingredients

- 2-8 oz Pkgs cream cheese, softened
- 1 packet Hidden Valley Original Ranch Dip Mix
- 3/4 cup stout beer (Yingling Black and Tan is a good one to use)
- 2 cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese


Preparation:

Mix the cream cheese and ranch dip mix together, then add the beer, mix, then cheddar cheese last. Great with pretzels!

NOTE: The 3/4 cup STOUT beer is the key to this recipe. Enjoy!







Submitted by Susan Millonig Ingredients



- 1 (16-oz) French bread loaf (I use brioche)
- 1 cup firmly packed light brown sugar
- 1/3 cup of butter melted
- 2 tbsp. maple syrup
- 3/4 cup chopped pecans
- 4 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 cup milk
- 2 tbsp granulated sugar
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

Preparation:

Cut 10 1-inch thick slices of bread. Reserve the remaining bread for another use. Stir together brown sugar, butter, and maple syrup. Pour into a 13 x 9-inch baking dish. Sprinkle with chopped pecans. Whisk together the eggs, milk, sugar, cinnamon, and vanilla. Arrange bread slices over pecans. Pour the egg mixture over the top. Cover and refrigerate for 8 hours (shorter chill time with brioche bread). Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Bake approximately 35 minutes or until golden brown. Serve immediately.
