I recently sent out a group email inviting the members to participate in this fun event but unfortunately I've only heard from two members. I hope to see as many of you as possible come to this so I'll be reaching out to you again and asking you to RSVP by <u>13 Sep.</u> After that it will be too late to sign up as the hosts/guests/meals will all be planned and put in place so please mark your calendars so you don't miss out! I'm including how it works again so you can refer to this in case you've forgotten.

HOW IT WORKS:

Have you ever been part of a progressive dinner party? They are great fun, a great way to meet new people, show off your home (or in this case your boat!), see other member's homes (boats!), and enjoy good food, fine drinks, and great friends. I really hope you can be a part of this fun filled event. Here's how it works: There will be a total of four courses served throughout the evening, each served on several different boats up and down the docks of Belmont Bay. You will start your evening with fine cocktails/appetizers on your first assigned boat, then you will enjoy a course of salad/soup on a second boat, followed by a main course on a third boat, and then a final course of dessert will be served on the lawn by the marina office so everyone can meet and talk, and share their experiences. Each boat serving a course will host between 3 and 4 couples each at their boat. At each of your stops you will be with a new group of fellow boaters. RSVP's have not gone out yet but all participants, once they have RSVP'd, will get notified ahead of time that will tell them which boat to go to for their first course. Upon completion of each course, your host boat's Captain will give each couple an envelope with the name and location of the boat they move to for their next course.
