

Michael disgustedly looked at Patrick and said,"Nice going, now we're going to have to pee in the boat.



Now might be a good time to switch out some of the old halogen or incandescent bulbs on your boat with some LEDs. Relatively inexpensive, fairly easy to do and you'll save a few precious watts and cut down on the heat generation more than expected. Turn on your lights for a bit and then

try to remove one without burning your fingers. They get hot! Not so with the LEDs.

There of course are several varieties of bulbs. An easy start is to check <u>Amazon</u> for some G4 LED lamps. I've used them on both my SeaRay and now the Meridian. The old and new ones both simply are prong types that you just pull out. The picture to the upper right shows the old bulb and package of the new bulb. Good Luck!
